

Greetings from Pastor Greg Schiller - Gutnius 2, 14 June 2025

I arrived back in the Barossa Valley on Thursday, after 13 weeks away, and have seen some lovely rain on the weekend!

The picture shows one of the very few sunny afternoons for my daily walk at Lutheran Highlands Seminary, Ogelbeng. I often walked around the student and staff food gardens, because longer walks to nearby villages could get me caught in the rain. Papua New Guineans are skilled food gardeners and plan their gardens for a continuing supply of fresh food. This is essential for the staff, who aren't

highly paid, and for the seminary student families, as the seminary budget, with the student fees, is not usually able to supply food – except in times of shortage.



Having lived at Ogelbeng before, I was caught off guard this time by the weather. It was an excessively long and very wet – wet season. I don't remember wet seasons like this at Ogelbeng. I remember very long and very wet – wet seasons in Lae. The locals also confirmed that we were experiencing an unusually wet and very long wet season. So, it wasn't just my failing memory.

Another challenge was the excessively long power outages – usually for a week or more at a time. Then on again for a short time and off again for another week or more. Usually, in the evenings, our campus generator

would give us 2-3 hours power. The limited time was because of the tight seminary budget. I coped as best I could with solar power set up in my office, and always keeping devices and power bank charged, using gas for cooking – but I was in the end not able to keep the fridge going with so little power.

As Term 1 came to a close, I spent time reflecting on how I could improve my teaching methods to better engage students in their learning. I decided to take a more practical and participatory approach — and it worked out really well!

Let me share one highlight from my Year 5 class on the Book of Revelation. Instead of focusing on the usual symbols and predictions often associated with Revelation, we explored how to preach from the text — a shift that matched the Revised Common Lectionary readings between Easter and Pentecost, which all had texts from Revelation.

Students told me they had never heard a Lutheran pastor preach on these passages. Their only exposure had been through groups using Revelation to scare people with timelines and predictions about the end times — missing the heart of Revelation's message. Together, we uncovered the true focus of the book: not on terrifying beasts, but on the Lamb — Jesus Christ — and his message of grace, peace, and encouragement to believers, especially in times of trial.

Because these students completed their practical year last year, they were already used to preparing sermons. So we worked through all six lectionary texts from Revelation for the Easter-to-Pentecost season. By the end of term, each student had produced outlines and full sermons on all six texts! I also modelled sermons from three of these texts during weekend devotions at student district gatherings.

I also shared with them a Revelation study I had first prepared over ten years ago for a Lutheran Secondary School students Bible camp here in PNG. So many of the seminary students were asking about Revelation that I had it printed and distributed to all students from Years 1 to 5.





I'm now planning to revise and translate it into Tok Pisin, as it was originally written in English. At my farewell services over Pentecost weekend, students expressed their excitement and confidence in preaching from Revelation. Many said they were ready to help our Lutheran Church in PNG

rediscover and proclaim the Good News (Gutnius) of Revelation. Even students from younger years are already looking forward to their Revelation classes!

This whole experience has made me want to rework how I teach this subject — and others. I'm also beginning to think about how I can help mentor other lecturers to take over these subjects, possibly through team teaching in the future.

In the coming weeks, I'd love to share more updates and stories with you — I wasn't able to send many newsletters during my time at Lutheran Highlands Seminary. At least now I'll have 24-hour electricity again... and I suppose I won't complain about the rain — we do need it!

I'm including a few extra photos of the seminary gardens for you to enjoy. Please note that gardening here means digging ditches – because of the torrential rainfall!
